

Prentiss County Jail Inmate Property List

Inmates may receive the following items one time and will only be accepted once. All items you wish to drop off must come together. The items must be brought Monday thru Friday during the hours of 8 am to 5 pm. You must present valid government identification at the time of dropping off the property.

3 white underwear

3 white t-shirts (no tank tops or muscle shirts)

3 white socks

3 white bras (no underwire)

1 white thermal underwear

3 paperback books (no hardback books, magazines, or newspapers)

No over-the-counter medications will be accepted but prescription non-narcotic medications will be as long as the medication is in a properly labeled container with inmates name and dosage.

Inmates may have money placed in their accounts in the following ways:

- **KIOSK IN JUSTICE CENTER LOBBY:** accepts cash, credit cards, and debit cards. There is a small service charge for this which is deducted from the total money your placing into the machine.
- **Western Union Quick Collect:** complete BLUE quick collect send form. You must use this information for western union, Pay to; *S S C* Code City and State; *COBRACASH/FL* Account number; *8M1 plus inmate 5 digit id number from jail and inmates last name*. You can also call in your transaction using a debit/credit card to 1-800-634-3422 option 2.
- **GOVERNMENT PAYMENT SERVICES:** must use debit/credit card and call 1-888-277-2535. You will need the following information to complete the transaction. Pay location code; *5500* Inmates last name Inmates 5 digit id number from jail Facility Code; *8M1*

Visitation is Saturday and Sunday 1 pm to 3 pm for males and 3 pm to 4 pm for females. You must call Monday thru Friday between 8am and 5 pm to make an appointment. (662) 728-2016. Only persons on the inmates completed visitor list will be allowed to visit. You must provide a valid government id to be admitted for visits and you may not bring any items into the jail with you. There is a dress code that must be followed and all persons entering jail are subject to being searched.
